

## Independent Learning Guide



Art & Design

You should be working for a minimum of three-hours per week per subject for independent work beyond what is set in lesson time.

Below is a list of suggested activities:

Ensure notes are completed and filed/stored suitably in a folder or book.

(continue to add with subject specific tasks)

- Act upon the teacher feedback and complete the targets set in the tutorial session to improve and develop your practical work.
- Read and research around your subject. Explore other artists by looking at different genres and specialisms.
- Complete artist research and analysis providing written work in draft form for feedback prior to presenting this in your sketchbook.
- Spend time developing the presentation of your sketchbook work and design boards.
- Regularly take photos to help inspire and support the development of your ideas and observations.
- Keep a separate sketchbook of observational drawings to develop your ideas and skills further.
- Experiment with new techniques and processes.
- Visit local galleries and art exhibitions to inspire your workmake notes about the artists, their techniques and processes and sketch artworks.
