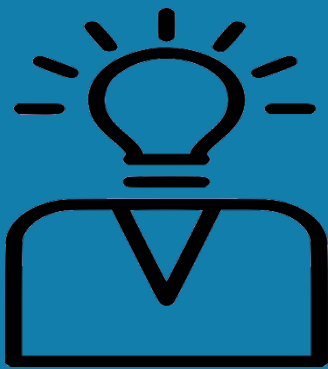




# Independent Learning Guide



## Geography

Ensure notes are completed and filed/stored suitably in a folder or book.

Students to research and complete notes on case studies from all course content.

Students to make a step by step guide to the formation of landforms with in physical geography

Students should support their learning from the lesson by using the relevant chapters in the textbook.

Students should use Seneca to reinforce their learning

Students must use the google classroom folder to look over areas of weakness from the personal learning checklist
