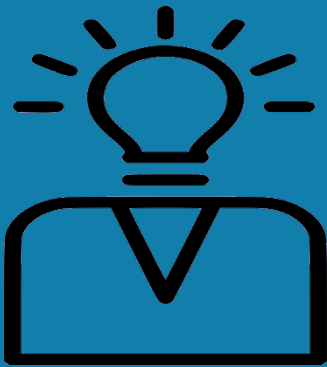


Independent Learning Guide



History

You should be working for a minimum of three-hours per week per subject for independent work beyond what is set in lesson time.

Below is a list of suggested activities:

Ensure notes are completed and filed/stored suitably in a folder or book.

Students to complete timelines, as guided by the teacher, to support future revision.

Students to read and make notes on the materials provided by the teacher and be ready to be tested on the content.

Students should support their learning from the lesson by using the relevant chapters in the textbook.

Students should engage with a range of other materials, as directed by the teacher.

Students must refer to the classroom on a weekly basis for specific instructions and tasks.

The key to success is reading around the subject. The expectation is that you will regularly read following the lesson.
